The Brand Tab of the Settings Page contains global settings to help ensure brand consistency across your marketing campaigns. There are two sections on the Brand Tab: Preferred Fonts and Custom Colors.

## Preferred Fonts

The Preferred Fonts section of the Brand tab allows you to:

1. Limit fonts available in the Email Builder & Landing Page Builder to the fonts you regularly use.
2. Declare additional custom web fonts to be used in your marketing material.

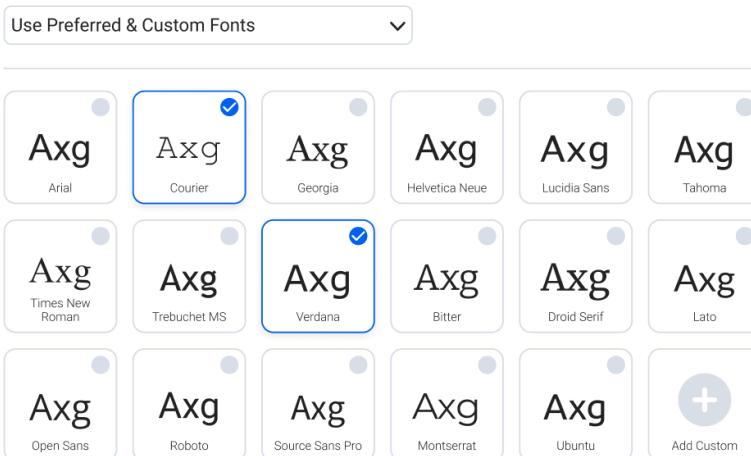
By default, the setting for Preferred Fonts on this page is set to **Use all Default Fonts**. This means that the full list of fonts, listed below, will be available to you in the Email & Landing Page Editors.

Here's all the fonts that are available out-of-the-box:

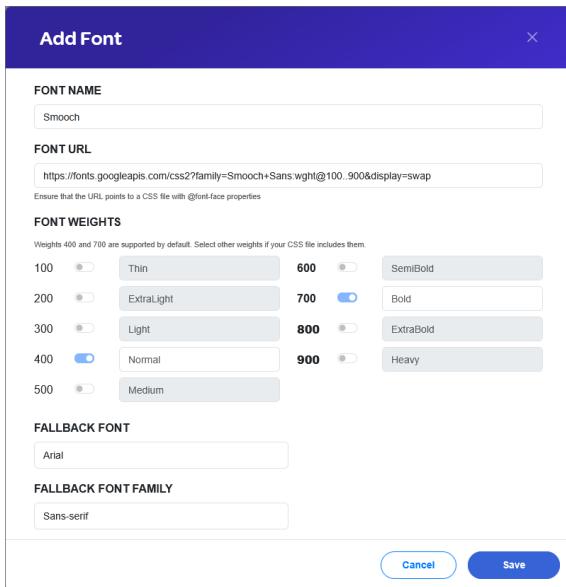
If you'd like to limit this list of fonts or import other fonts from the web, change the selection in the drop-down to **Use Preferred & Custom Fonts**. Upon changing this selection, you'll be able to click the tiles for the fonts you plan to use in the Editors. Additionally, clicking the **Add Custom** tile at the end of the list will allow you to pull a public web font into Ascent360.



The selected fonts here will be the **only** fonts that appear in the Email & Landing Page Editors. Emails or Landing Pages that are already saved with other fonts will be unaffected.

## Add a Custom Font

You may add custom web fonts by clicking the **Add Custom** tile at the end of the list.



1. **Name the font** - this is the name that will be shown in the font drop-down in the Editor. We recommend inputting the true font name here, but you are free to name it something else. For example, you may choose to name it semantically to indicate usage (Rubik - Body Font).
2. **Provide a Font URL** - Provide the URL of the font for Ascent360 to reference. **The URL needs to point to a CSS file with @font-face properties (see examples below)**.
3. **Choose available font weights** - designate the font weights that you want to be available for this font in the editor. By default, font weights 400 and 700 (normal and bold) are enabled and cannot be disabled. Font weight settings are available on the *Title*, *Button*, *Paragraph*, and *List* content blocks. You may rename the weights after enabling them. If you enable weights other than 400 or 700, be sure that the link you provided contains @font-face properties with a configuration for these weights (this is usually something you configure before obtaining the link from Google Fonts or Font Library).
4. **Declare a Fallback Font** - Choose a font from the list of default fonts to serve as the fallback font in the event that the custom font is unavailable.
5. **Declare a Fallback Font Family** - Choose a font family from the list to serve as the secondary fallback in the event that neither the custom font nor the primary fallback font can be rendered.

## Provide the Web Font URL

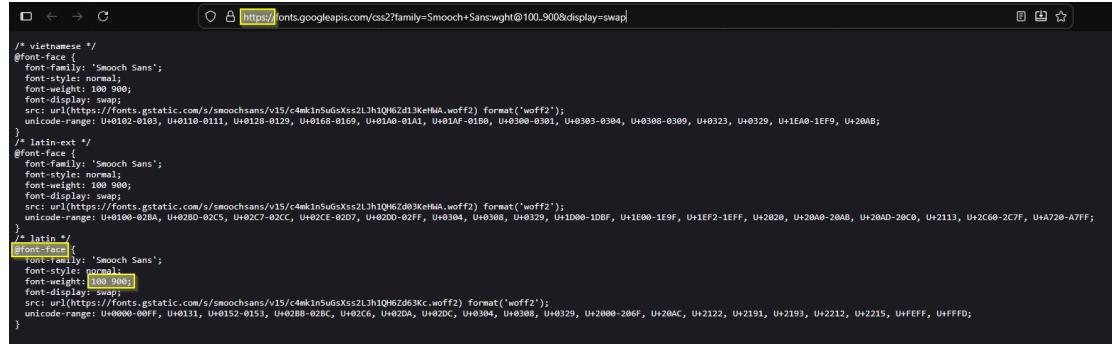
It's important to provide the right web font URL when adding the custom font; if the URL is wrong, Ascent360 won't be able to load your custom font. In order to be valid, the font URL must fulfill these criteria:

1. The URL needs to point to a CSS file with @font-face properties.
2. The CSS needs to be hosted in HTTPS.
3. Contains the font weights you intend to use.

To test this, enter your font URL into your browser - it should load with a page with plain text (the CSS file for this

font). Look for these elements:

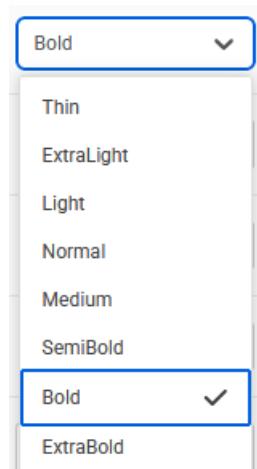

## Using Custom Font Weights

If you have added extra weights beyond regular and bold, the *Title*, *Button*, *Paragraph*, and *List* content blocks will contain the weights as named in Settings.

- Click Get Font
- On the resulting page, click Get Embed Code
- On the resulting page, click the @Import option
- Copy the link contained in the URL parameter. Only the family URL parameter is needed, as shown highlighted

below.

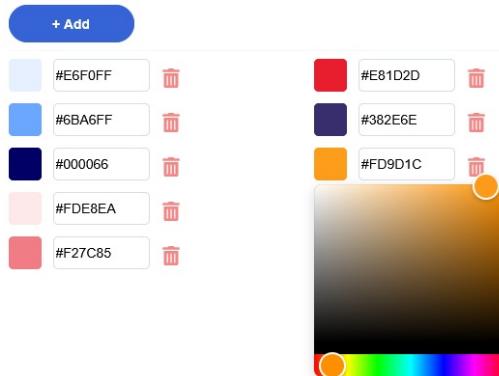

## Brand Colors

The Brand Colors section of the Brand tab allows you to define up to 10 hex colors for quick access within the Email Editor and Landing Page builder.

You may type the color or click the swatch to select from a color picker.



Colors designated here will be shown in any of the color pickers within the editors for quick access.
